224 Katahdin sheep to be exact! Yes, the sheep have arrived at UGF. Ewe may have heard the bleating calls from our newest employees who arrived on the fields about three weeks ago and have been happily munching on our cover crops and beautiful pasture at our Maple View Farm site.

We are so excited they are here! Sheep play an integral role on our regenerative farm by not only trimming the cover crops in our pasture, but also by fertilizing the fields. Studies show the saliva secreted by the sheep activate certain auxins in the cover crops to stimulate growth and strengthen the root systems.
